The first in-person meeting of the newly formed Commission follows the 2017 annual meeting of the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy

ALEXANDRIA, Virginia, September 13, 2017 – The Physical Therapy Compact Commission (PTCC) and the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT) are pleased to announce that the first in-person meeting of the PTCC will be on Sunday, November 5, from 8:00 AM to 11:00 AM, MT, at the Hyatt Regency in Santa Ana Pueblo, New Mexico. The two organizations are co-locating the meetings to reduce travel costs and time for the delegates and public expected to attend.
